

Funding

Participants are generally sponsored by their employer or a funding agency. Harvard University does not provide scholarships or tuition waivers. Agencies offering financial assistance for training of this kind include USAID (United States Agency for International Development), SIDA (Swedish International Development Agency), The World Bank, and the Ford Foundation. When possible, funding applications should be submitted to the agency's resident or regional representative for the applicant's country. Funding should be secured as soon as possible after notification of provisional acceptance to the Program, as training funds are limited and the approval process often lengthy. HIID must receive official commitments from funders by May 1, 2000.
