A Summary of the Presentation

- More than one-half (55.9%) of the elder abuse cases reported by care managers were multi-abuse cases, in which multiple types of abuse occurred together.
- About three-fourth (74.0%) of the elder abuse cases that involved life-threatening situation were those in which multiple types of abuse occurred together.
- Overall, the extent of seriousness of abuse and neglect tended to be greater when multiple types of abuse and neglect occurred together.
- Abusers (many of whom were not aware that they were committing the abuse of older people) were not likely to seek assistance even if they were involved with lifethreatening cases of elder abuse.
