- 活動:役場などの前に設置された救護所や避難所を巡回し、健康相談が行った。
- 石巻保健福祉事務所からは、各町へ2名ずつ3日間に渡り、延べ18人派遣した。  
Cumulated- 18 staff personnel dispatched to 2 towns

## 訪問健康相談

### At home assessment and consultation

- 対象:全被災世帯 Total suffering householders
- 日時:8月4日～11日 From Day 9 to 16
- 構成:被災3町を除く石巻地区の1市6町および石巻保健福祉事務所から延べ51名、保健師等技術職員2名と連絡員1名の3名体制、3町に各2チーム計18名程度を毎日派遣
- 活動:17時以降の夕方から夜間にかけて、避難所や被災世帯を訪問。During evening and night.
- 結果:矢本町5759世帯、河南町351世帯、鳴瀬町467世帯を訪問。フォローの必要な世帯や、要介護認定が必要とされる世帯などが明らかになった。緊急性の高い要フォロー者には速やかな対応が行われた。結果の詳細は、現在まとめている途中であるとのことだった。






## ICSとは


- 複数の機関が大災害発生時等に協働して対応を行うことを可能にするためのマネジメントのシステム
- 1970年代カリフォルニアでの大規模火災消火活動で複数消防署間での調整がうまくゆかずミス
  - 命令系統が不明瞭だった（誰が責任者か）
  - 複数機関を前提とした「システム」を含めた計画が事前の検討においてなかった
  - 複数機関の間での統一のマネジメント組織がなかった
  - 統一された用語がなかった

## ICS の組織図





<p>Red Flag Warning issued by the National Weather Service remains in effect for the mountains of Ventura and Los Angeles Counties for prolonged low humidity levels &amp; high fire danger.</p> <p>An upper level low pressure system will affect the southern California coast and certain off-shore through midweek, and persistent low-level high pressure will affect the region. For Monday, winds will be fairly light across the mountains and valleys in the west of the San Gorgonio Pass area. Low daytime humidity levels add rise slightly and remain above current weather thresholds, then be followed with much improved recovery of fog.</p> <p>A dispersion marine layer will continue this week for all coastal areas and into some valley locations up to about 1500 feet elevation. This will result in low cloud cover that will slowly revert to the beaches each day, an onshore sea breeze, and low-level atmospheric inversions.
