LAW OF THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA No.29/2004 REGARDING THE MEDICAL PRACTICE

The establishment of medical practice as the essence of efforts in providing medical treatment should be done by the doctors or dentists with strong ethics and moral, capability and authority

3. Provide legal certainty to the community as well as doctors / dentists.

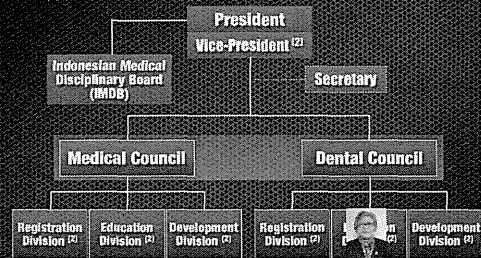

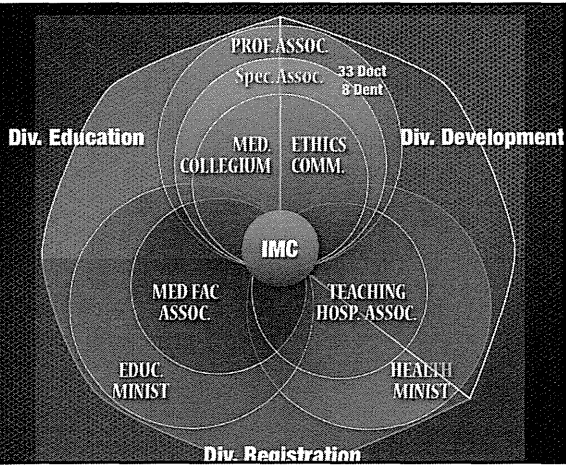

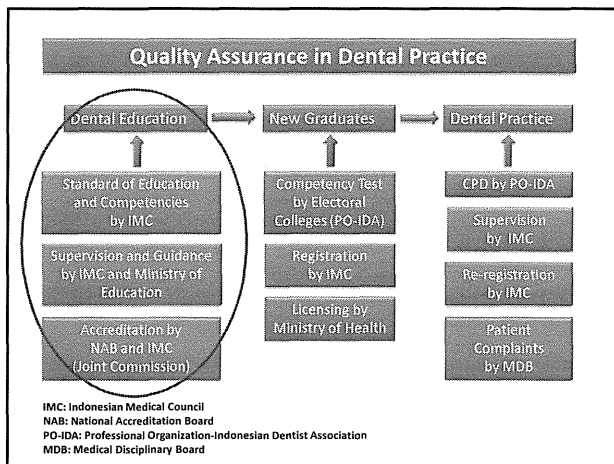
Seventeen members of the council's board were appointed by the President of the Republic as members of the Indonesian Medical Council.

FUNCTIONS

- a. Perform Registration of doctors / dentists;
- b. Legalize standards of Education of doctors / dentists;
- c. Supervision of medical practices in cooperation with the relevant institutions, in accordance with their respective functions.

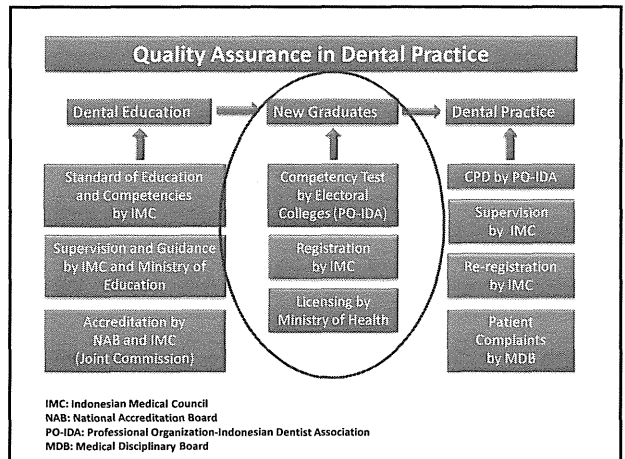


Indonesian Medical Council

- Monitoring and evaluation of Medical and Dental Institutions by IMC are part of the quality assurance activities for dental practices in Indonesia.
- Monitoring and evaluation are conducted by the educational division of IMC with the following objectives:
 - Monitoring to what degree the educational and competency standards are already being implemented by educational institutions.
 - Identifying what challenges the institutions are facing in the implementation of educational standards.

Indonesian Medical Council

- Assisting and facilitating educational institutions to overcome problems
- Helping educational institutions in the preparation of accreditation by the National Accreditation Board
- The results of the monitoring and evaluation are used as a reference to design joint policies, in cooperation with the government (Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education)



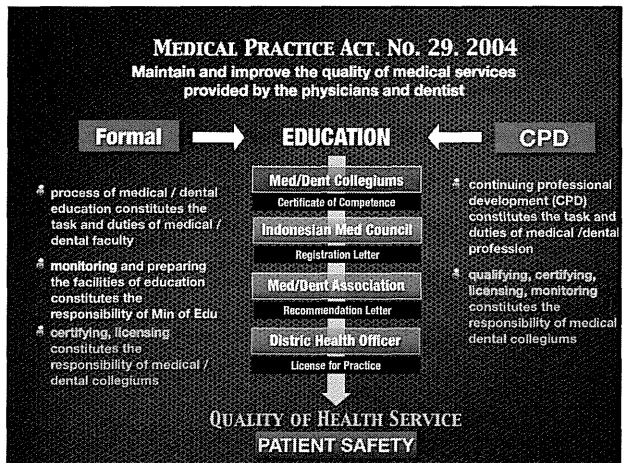
THE INDONESIAN MEDICAL COUNCIL

MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT. No. 29. 2004

The main functions of the council are

- Registering doctors and dentists,
- Legalizing standards of medical and dental education, and
- Guiding good practices with the Ministry of Health, local government and other institutions.

- Re-registration is required once every five year along with a specific number of CME units. Till November 2009, 106.000 doctors and dentists were registered. The Council is expected to start re-registration of all doctors and dentists in December 2010.
- Medical and dental standards have been legalized, and permanent guidelines issued. Regulations on sound medical practices, good relationship between doctors and patients, and disciplinary norms were finalized.
- The fund to run the council is received from the government and channeled through the Department of Health.

PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCES REQUIRED FOR THE PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY IN INDONESIA



Indonesian Medical Council

- The assessment of dentists, both Indonesian and foreign, is done through two different channels that result in the receipt of a competency certificate.
- For dentists who have recently graduated, this certificate can be obtained by way of a competency test which is implemented four times per year.
- Dentists that are already registered can obtain the certificate through continuing professional development.
- The competence certificate is issued after the dentist has accumulated 30 Professional Credit Units, every five years, as all dentists need to re-register every five years.



Indonesian Medical Council

- The competency certificate is issued by the Indonesian College of Dentists (Professional Organization) in accordance with the Law on Medical Practice number 29, 2004.
- After the Indonesian College of Dentists (PO) has declared that the dentist has “passed”, a registration letter will be issued by the Indonesian Medical Council, which allows the dentist to operate a practice.

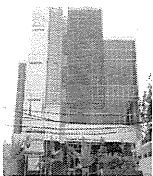
Registration as a Legal Authority for Dental practice

- All dentists who wish to practice dentistry in Indonesia “have to be registered” to the Indonesia Dental Council at IMC (KKI).
- The IMC is the regulatory and quality control body for the dental and medical profession in the Indonesia.
- “It is illegal to practice dentistry” for unregistered dentists/dental specialist



Indonesian Medical Council

Registration letter (STR) is an official record of dentists who own certificate of competence and other qualifications to perform dental practice.



- IMC will issue Registration letter (STR) for registered dentist with 5 years competence validity.
- Doctor and dentist with expired STR or whose competency level has changed are obliged to re-register at IMC.



Indonesian Medical Council

Type of Registrations

1. Registration for Indonesian dentist/dental specialist
2. Temporary registration for foreign dentist who conduct training, research or dental practices.
3. Conditional registration for participants of dental education and training (PPDGS) for foreign dentist
 - IMC's approval for foreign doctor and dentist who will conduct in terms of transferring of knowledge and technology
 - Good Standing Certificates for dentists going abroad

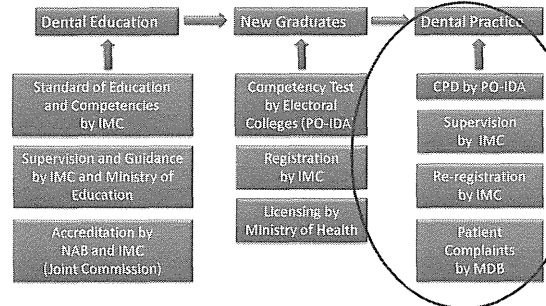

- Pursuant to the law of the Republic of Indonesia Number 29 of 2004 regarding Medical Practice Chapter VIII
- Indonesian Medical Disciplinary Board (IMDB) is an autonomous Institution of the Indonesian Medical Council
- (IMDB) shall be independent in performing its task
- IMDB shall responsible (administratively) to the Indonesian Medical Council (IMC).

Membership of IMDB consist of :

- a. 8 Originated from their respective professional
- b. 3 Bachelor of law

Major Categories That May Impose To Disciplinary Sanctions :

1. Incompetent
 2. Lack of professional responsibility
 3. Unacceptable behavior that makes the profession dishonored
- These 3 categories break down into 28 grounds of disciplinary sanction



Historical Overview


1902 – School of Medicine, Hanoi




Medical school (Western Medicine) for the whole Indochina peninsula – Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia

- 1935: Dental Section *belongs to* the Mixed School of Medicine and Pharmacy of Hanoi
- 1940: The Mixed School of Medicine and Pharmacy at Sai gon
- 1954: Dental Section *belongs to* the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy of Saigon
- 1962: Faculty of Dental Surgery of Saigon (5 year curriculum, *plus one year before entry at Faculty of Sciences - total 6 years*)
- 1971: The name was changed into Faculty of Dentistry of Saigon
- 1971: School of Dental Nurses of Saigon opened (2,5 year – curriculum)

- 1975: The name was changed into Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, Ho Chi Minh (6 year)
- 1976: Dental laboratory Technicians Section (2,5 year)
- 1996: Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Can Tho
- 1999: Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Hue
- 1999: Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medicine, Ha Noi
- 2008: Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Thai Nguyen
- 2010: Faculty of Odonto-Stomatology, University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Hai Phong

There are three basic requirements for dental licensure.

- 1. Education Requirement**
DDS or DMD degree from a university-based dental education program accredited by the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation
Currently, 64 accredited dental programs
- 2. Written Examination Requirement**
Pass the National Board Dental Examinations
Part I (basic sciences) and Part II (clinical)
- 3. Clinical Examination Requirement**
Pass the clinical examinations by regional dental testing agencies or by individual state boards of dentistry

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Dental License Regulations in California

The Dental Board of California governs the qualifications for and the practice of dentistry within the state.



Business and Professions Code, Section 1715

Licenses issued under the provisions of this chapter, unless specifically excepted, expire at 12 midnight on the legal birth date of a licensee of the board during the second year of a two-year term if not renewed.

The minimum requirement for 2-year renewal period is 50 hours of continuing education.


The renewal fee is \$365.

 - > Maximum of 4 hours of Basic Life Support: BLS
 - Courses in the actual delivery of dental services to the patient or the community**
 - > preventive services, diagnostic protocols and procedures
 - > nutrition and nutrition counseling of the patient
 - > esthetic, corrective and restorative oral health diagnosis and treatment
 - > individual and community health emergencies

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- Courses limited to a maximum of 20% of a licensee's total required course unit credits**
 - > recall and scheduling systems, production flow, communication systems and data management
 - > management of the dental practice
 - > leadership development and team development
 - > teaching methodology and curricula development
 - Courses not be recognized for CE credit**
 - > money management, the licensee's personal finances or personal business matters
 - > general physical fitness, weight management
 - > purchase or sale of a dental practice or office
 - > provision of elective facial cosmetic surgery


