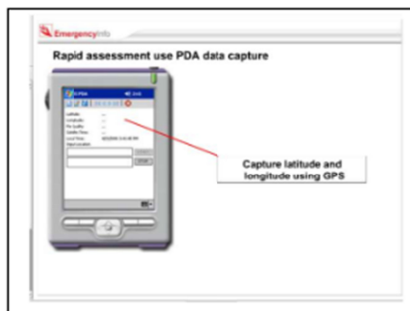
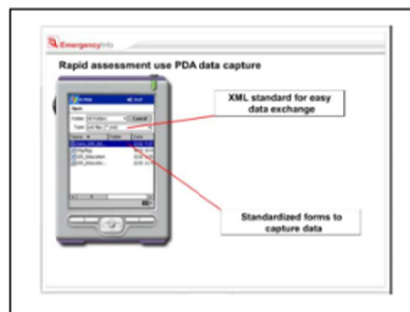
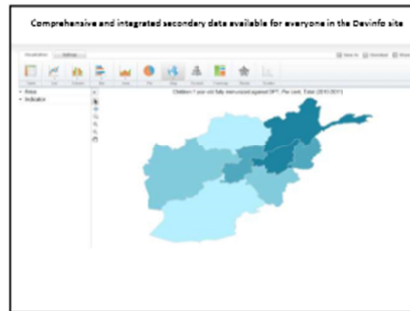


- ### Key Requirements for CCC
- Good health **pre-crisis** secondary data including sub-national (e.g. district) level profiles;
 - Quality health assessments completed in a timely manner at the beginning of a crisis;
 - An appropriate **early warning and response** system for epidemic-prone diseases and **Nutrition**;
 - An appropriate health monitoring/surveillance system that provides regular data on mortality, morbidity, injury treatment and rehabilitation, potential health risks, and **health service performance**;

Critical steps to make epidemiological data effective for the vulnerable children

1. Reporting
2. Data Accumulation
3. Data Analysis
4. Judgment and Action with resources





Lessons learned

- Early Warning and Reponses System (EWARS) is needed;
- Consensus on a short list of priority conditions to be monitored, corresponding syndrome-based definitions;
- Consensus on a standard reporting format;
- Building on existing early warning systems;
- Reliable and rapid means of communication is key;
- Information should be gathered from a wide range of sources including the news-media, and informal sources, such as **Health Map** and **Social Network System**;

Health Map: Combination of disparate data sources, including online news aggregators, eyewitness reports, expert-curated discussions and validated official reports
