## Progress of our research

- To analyse publicly funded cancer research grants in Japan and to provide evidences to the government for the fund allocation of cancer research
- Progress since last year
  - Developed a public cancer research fund database accommodating all publicly available cancer research data with CSO/site codes from 3 Ministries (MHLW, MEXT, METI) in 3 years (2011 – 13)
  - Analyse allocation of cancer research funding in Japan
  - Comparative analysis between US, UK and Japan
  - Test automated CSO/site coding with Uber Research

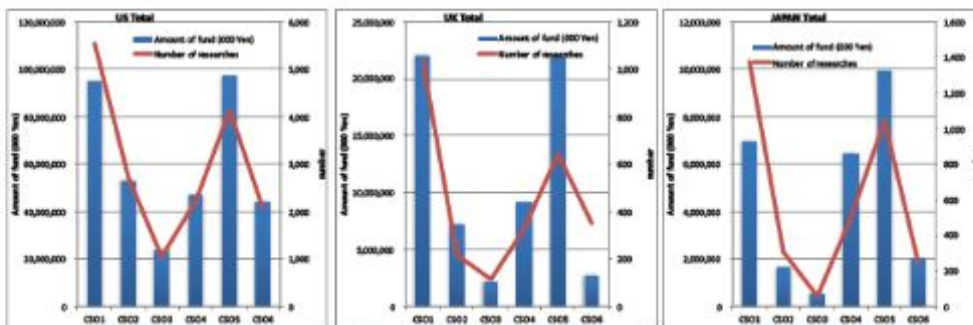

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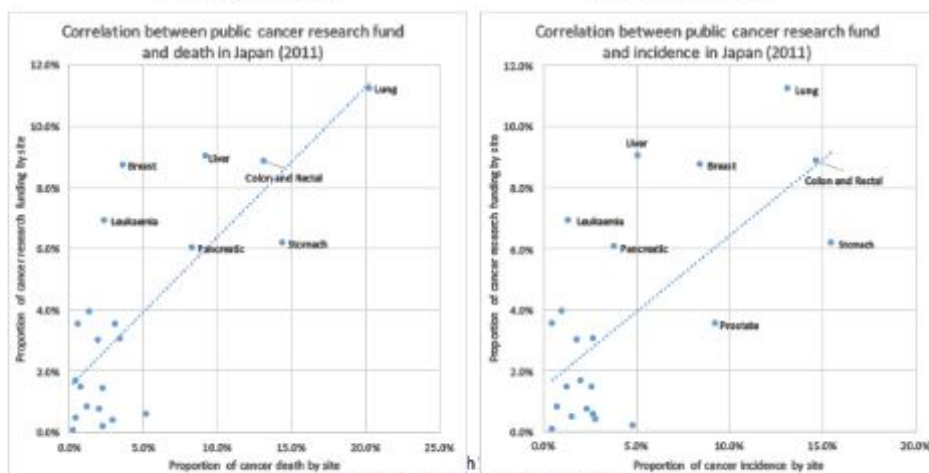

$$r = 0.483 \text{ (} p < 0.05 \text{)}$$



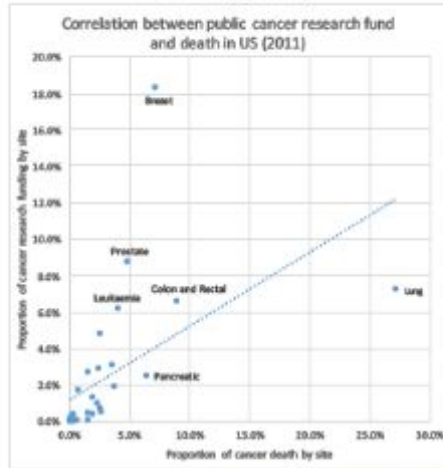

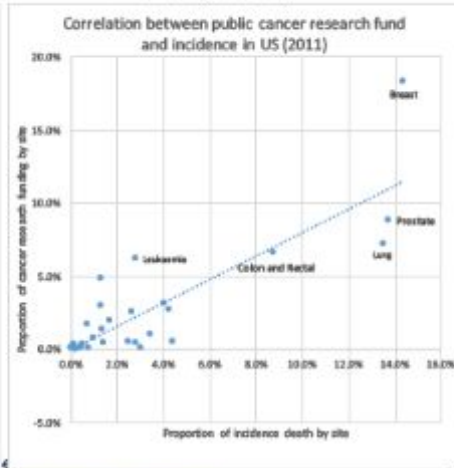

$r = 0.781$  ( $p < 0.01$ )

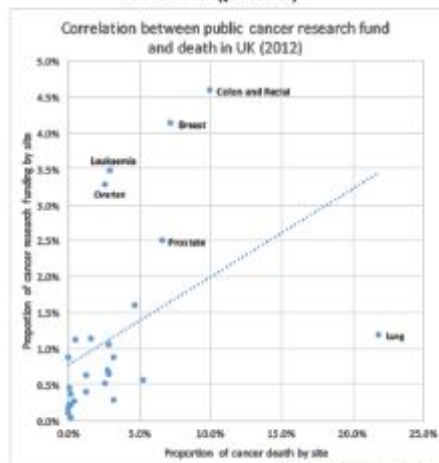


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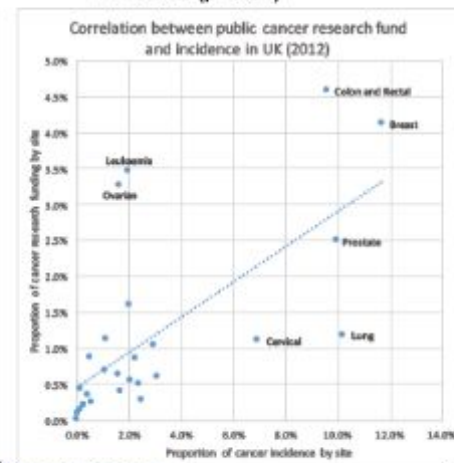
